JUDGES FOR PATENT PILOT PROGRAM ANNOUNCED IN THE NORTHERN DISTRICT OF ILLINOIS

In June, the Northern District of Illinois was selected as one of 14 courts to participate in a "Patent Pilot Program." Newly-filed patent cases will still be randomly assigned among all of the Northern District judges. The randomly-assigned judge may then opt to keep the case, or, <u>as of today</u> any randomly-assigned judge who is not designated as a "Patent Pilot Judge" has 30 days to decline hearing that case. Such cases are then randomly assigned to one of the following <u>Patent Pilot Judges</u>:

The Patent Pilot Program is authorized to run for ten years in the Northern District of Illinois as well as these 13 other pilot districts: Northern, Central and Southern Districts of California, Nevada, New Jersey, Eastern and Southern Districts of New York, Western District of Pennsylvania, and the Eastern, Northern, and Western Districts of Texas.
